## Review of First Angel's Message

Over the last several weeks we have looked at the First Angel's Message, which comprises five parts: the Everlasting Gospel, Fear God, Give Glory to Him, for The Hour of His Judgment is Come, and to Worship Him that Made. We have seen that the first five churches will blow these messages of the first angel again in a contemporary setting, just as it was given in the 1840s originally (Recall Rev 10:11).

We have just two of the seven parts of the Three Angel's Message left—which corresponds to the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> Church, Philadelphia and Laodicea. In our study Monday evening, we will look at the Second Angel's Message, involving the 6<sup>th</sup> Church, Philadelphia.

### BABYLON IS FALLEN, IS FALLEN (vs.8)

As part of this lesson, there is an Addendum of SOP statements concerning the Second Angel's Message. The questions and fill in the blanks below involve reading those statements for understanding. We will then discuss these in our Bible Study Monday evening, possibly doing something similar with Zoom's whiteboard as we did last week.

#### But first, some history on Babylon—

The ancient, literal city as we have seen in the book of Daniel was already a desolate ruin by John's day (cf Isa.13:19), but for understanding the expressions used in the Revelation we must understand its role historically. {For additional study, see Isa 47:1; Jer 25:12; 50:1; Eze 26:13.}

In the Babylonian language, the name *Bab-ilu* (Babel, or Babylon) meant "gate of the gods." {Recall, that at the time of the Tower of Babel, the descendants of Noah's sons did not believe in God's promise, that He would not destroy the world again by a flood. So the built a tower, to reach up to heaven. Hence, the 'gate of the gods.') The Hebrews derogatorily associated it with *balal*, meaning "to confuse" (cf Gen 11:9). Babylon was first founded by Nimrod (see Gen 10:10; 11:1-9).

From the very beginning the city was emblematic of disbelief in the true God and defiance of His will, and its tower a monument to apostasy, a citadel of rebellion against Him. The prophet Isaiah identifies Lucifer as the invisible king of Babylon (see Isa14:4, 12-14). In fact, it would seem conclusive Satan designed that Babylon should be the center and agency of his master plan to secure control of the human race, just as God designed to work through Jerusalem. Thus, throughout OT times, the two cities typified the forces of evil and good at work in the world.
